

## **The Thomas Allan Collection**

### **Thomas Allan (1774-1845)**

Thomas Allan was born near Malton, North Yorkshire. He was married to Esther (d. 21 November 1844), the daughter of Thomas Robinson, merchant and ship owner. They had two sons, Thomas Robinson Allan (d. 8 December 1866) who was also a solicitor and Joseph William Allan (d. 10 February 1848).

A solicitor and political adviser to the Wesleyan Methodists, Thomas Allan was considered to be one of the most important laymen of his generation. Based in Frederick's Place, Old Jewry, London, he was appointed WM connexional legal adviser in 1803. He came to prominence as a member of the Committee of Privileges opposing Lord Sidmouth's Bill. The Bill would have effectively put in jeopardy Methodism's use of local preachers and even threatened the itinerancy itself. Seen as a threat to religious liberties, it was opposed by the Committee which was set up in 1803 to protect nonconformist rights under the Toleration Act. Thomas Allan produced 700 WM petitions against the Bill which contained 30,000 signatures. As a result of the petitions and in the face of growing opposition, the Bill was dropped after its second reading. He was responsible for masterminding the new Toleration Act of 1812 which was of importance to all the Free Churches.

Thomas Allan was a leading member of the Protestant Union, founded in 1813, and opposed Catholic Emancipation in 1829 and grants to Catholic schools. As a local preacher, he preached to the poor in the workhouses and smaller chapels. He died at Brighton on 26 September 1845.

### **The Thomas Allan Collection**

This is a significant collection which will prove useful for researchers into Methodism and the early 19<sup>th</sup> century in general. It contains letters from 3 Prime ministers (Henry Addington, Spencer Perceval and Lord Liverpool), numerous bishops, government ministers and senior legal figures. The subjects covered by the archive include the Toleration Act controversy, medicine, Roman Catholic emancipation, and anti-slavery.

### **Provenance**

The collection was probably compiled by the Allan family and passed to the WM Connexion in London sometime after Thomas Allan's death in 1845. It was retained there by the Methodist Church until 1977 at which time it was transferred to the John Rylands Library on permanent deposit as part of the Methodist Archives and Research Centre.

### **Arrangement and content**

The collection consists of 22 boxes of manuscript and printed material comprising letters, documents, and personal papers relating to Thomas Allan's role as a solicitor and also concerning his opposition to the Toleration Act and Lord Sidmouth's Bill. The collection has been listed by item and where an asterisk appears, this indicates that there is biographical information which can be found

at the end of the catalogue. The items have been retained in the original box order and have been listed accordingly. The first part of the reference number relates to the box to which the material belongs.

Up to leaf 11: general notes on Annuity – form of the writ, process at law etc ... From leaf 11 to the end: form of the particular writ and an account of the trial between Thomas Jones and John Hughes on a plea of annuity in Middlesex. Probably taken from Littleton (pencilled reference at top of page)
- 2/7** Unbound notebook, foliated. The contents are in chapter form and so are possibly abstracted from some legal authority such as Blackstone. However, nowhere is this stated, no name is given, nor is there any contents page. Headings are as follows: 2R – 236 .....Fines..... Both of the above enclosed small scraps of scribbled notes, 3 and 2 respectively. There were a great many scraps of paper (often the rough notes of the fair copy which made up the packets) scattered through this box, particularly in the last item. Mostly, they have been collected and put at the very bottom of the box, since it seemed unnecessary to number and describe each one

- 22/58** Letter, 29 October 1814 from Vansittart, Downing Street to 'Z' via Charles Abbott, Mitre Court Building, Temple
- 22/59** Undated letter sent by C. Abbott to Thomas Allan, to accompany item **22/59**. Also included is a draft letter to Vansittart written by C. Abbott. There is a comment added to that letter written by the Lord Chancellor
- 22/60** Draft letter, 4 March 1815 from 'Z' to Mr Vansittart. A note inscribed on the back states 'To Mr Vansittart left by T.R.A. on evening of 4 March 1815. Mr Abbott witnessed my inclosing of bills.'
- 22/61** Letter, 6 March 1815 from N. Vansittart acknowledging receipt of the letter, 4 March 1815 from 'Z'. Notes on the reverse by C. Abbott confirms that Thomas Allan is 'Z'

- 22/63** Letter, 28 March 1815 from Thomas Allan, Frederick's Place to Rev'd. Jameson, Methodist Chapel, Manningtree
- 22/64** Two pages of biographical notes about John Wesley, possibly written by Joseph Butterworth\*. One page of notes is difficult to read but mentions the Reading Case and Ward's letter

*Henry Addington, 1st Viscount Sidmouth, (1757-1844), became speaker of the House of Commons in 1789. On the resignation of William Pitt the Younger in 1801, he became Prime Minister, a position he held until 1804. In 1811 he introduced a bill in to the House of Lords proposing to amend the Toleration Act.*

*Henry Bathurst, 3<sup>rd</sup> Earl Bathurst*, (1762-1834), Foreign Secretary from October to December 1809 under Spencer Perceval.

*John Beecham* (1787–1856), Wesleyan Methodist minister. He was appointed to the office of general secretary of the Wesleyan Missionary Society in 1831, a post he held for twenty-four years.

*Joseph Benson* (1748-1821) Wesleyan minister, President of Conference in 1798 and 1810 and served as its secretary in 1805 and 1809.

*George Birkbeck* (1776-1841), doctor, academic, philanthropist and founder of Birkbeck College, London.

*Bishop of Durham, Shute Barrington* (1734-1826), Bishop of Llandaff, Bishop of Salisbury and Bishop of Durham from 1791-1826.

*Bishop of Saint David's* from 1803-1825; *Thomas Burgess* (1756–1837) was an English author and philosopher.

*Bishops of Winchester:*

John Thomas (1696-1781) from 1761-81.

Brownlow North (1741-1820) from 1781-1820.

Charles Richard Sumner (1790-1874) from 1827-69.

*Thomas Blanshard* (c.1765-1824) entered the Methodist ministry in 1795 and served as a circuit minister in England and Wales until 1808 when he was appointed Book Steward.

*Isaac Bradnock* (1774-1833), appointed as a missionary to the West Indies in 1801 and worked there for six years. Upon his return to England he worked as a circuit minister until his death.

*Robert Hobart, 4th Earl of Buckinghamshire* (1760–1816), politician. He served as Secretary of State for War and the Colonies from 1801 to 1804, as Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster in 1805 and again in 1812, as Postmaster General from 1806 to 1807 and as President of the Board of Control from 1812 to 1816.

*Jabez Bunting* (1779-1858) became a Wesleyan minister in 1799. He served four terms as President of Conference, held office as the secretary of the Conference from 1814 to 1819 and again from 1824 to 1827.

*Joseph Butterworth* (1770-1826) was a Wesleyan layman who occupied an important place in Methodist councils. He was born in Coventry, the son of a Baptist minister and moved to London as an apprentice harness plater. He later became a successful law bookseller in Fleet Street, London and founder of a well known firm of law publishers. He was a founding member of the Committee of Privileges and was well known as an anti-slavery campaigner.

*Adam Clarke* (? 1760-1832) began preaching in 1782 and became a Wesleyan minister later that year. He served three terms as President of the Wesleyan Conference.

*Thomas Clarkson* (1760-1846) was a slavery abolitionist and a member of the Committee for the Abolition of the Slave Trade.

*Thomas Coke* (1747-1814), served two terms as President of the Wesleyan Conference and also presided regularly over the Irish Conference.

*Rev. George Collison* (1772-1847), Congregational minister and educator.

*Sir John Singleton Copley, Lord Lyndhurst* (1772-1863), lawyer and politician. He was the Lord Chancellor on three occasions and became Attorney General in 1824.

*William Coxe* (1748-1828), historian and Church of England clergyman.

*Rev. John Emory* (1789-1835), American Methodist bishop.

*Thomas Erskine, 1st Baron Erskine*, (1750-1823), served as Lord Chancellor from 1806-1807.

*Henry Petty Fitzmaurice, 3rd Marquess of Lansdowne*, (1780-1863), a British statesman, who during his career served as Home Secretary, Chancellor of the Exchequer and was Lord President of the council three times.

*Henry Richard Fox* (later *Vassall*) (1773-1840), 3rd Baron Holland of Holland and 3rd Baron Holland of Foxley, was a major figure in Whig politics in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century.

*James Gambier, 1<sup>st</sup> Baron Gambier* (1756-1833), naval officer, Admiral of the Fleet and evangelical activist. On his retirement he became the first president of the Church Missionary Society.

*William Ewart Gladstone* (1809-98), Liberal politician. He served as British Prime Minister four times during the period 1868-1894, and was also Chancellor of the Exchequer on four occasions.

*Henry Goulburn* (1784-1856), statesman and chief secretary for Ireland.

*Charles Grey, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl Grey*, (1764-1845), a member of the Whig Party who was noted for advocating Parliamentary reform and Catholic Emancipation.

*Sir William Horne* (1774-1860), liberal politician and barrister. In 1830 he was appointed Solicitor-General for England and Wales.

*Robert Banks Jenkinson* (1770-1828), 2nd Earl of Liverpool and Prime Minister from 1812-1827.

*Lord Chief Justice of England, Charles Abbott, 1st Baron Tenterden* (1762 –1832), barrister and judge who served as the Lord Chief Justice of the King's Bench from 1818-1832.

*Zachary Macaulay* (1768-1838), abolitionist and a member of the Society for the Abolition of the Slave Trade. In 1823 he helped to organize the Anti-Slavery Society and became editor of its monthly publication, the *Anti-Slavery Reporter*.

*William Mansel* (1753-1820), Master of Trinity College, Cambridge from 1798 to his death in 1820, and also Bishop of Bristol from 1808 to 1820.

*Gideon Ouseley* (1762-1839) preached for some time as an independent evangelist. After the Irish Rebellion of 1798 he was invited by the Irish Methodist Conference to join a team of Irish-speaking preachers working specifically among the Roman Catholic poor.

*Spencer Perceval* (1762-1812), Prime Minister from 1809 until his assassination in 1812.

*Francis Edward Rawdon-Hastings, 1st Marquess of Hastings* (1754-1826), known as the Earl of Moira between 1793 and 1816. He was an Irish-British politician and military officer who served as Governor-General of India from 1813-1823.

*William Roberts* (1767-1849), English barrister and legal writer.

*John Russell, 6<sup>th</sup> Duke of Bedford*, (1766-1839), landowner and politician.

*Granville Sharp* (1735-1813), one of the first English campaigners for the abolition of the slave trade.

*John Shore, 1st Baron Teignmouth* (1751-1834). Governor-general of India and founder and first President of the British and Foreign Bible Society.

*Robert Smith, 1st Baron Carrington*, (1752-1838), banker and politician.

*George John Spencer, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl Spencer* (1758-1834), politician and book collector, he was Home Secretary from 1806 to 1807 under Lord Grenville in the Ministry of All the Talents.

*Christopher [Christian] Sundius* (1754-1835) became one of the founder members of the British and Foreign Bible Society and was among the first promoters and directors of the London Missionary Society.

*Thomas Vasey*, (c.1746-1826), Anglican evangelical minister.

*Henry Venn* (1796-1873), Anglican minister, described as “one of the foremost Protestant Mission Strategists of the 19<sup>th</sup> century”.

*William Vincent* (1739-1818), headmaster of Westminster School for fourteen years, dean of Westminster and classical scholar.

*Richard Colley Wesley, Marquess Wellesley* (1760–1842), brother of the Duke of Wellington, Anglo-Irish politician, governor-general of Bengal, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and Lord Lieutenant of Ireland.

*Charles Wesley junior* (1757-1834), organist, composer and son of Charles Wesley (1707-88).

*Sally Wesley* (1759-1828), Methodist writer and fourth child of Charles Wesley (1707-88).

*William Wilberforce* (1759-1833), politician, philanthropist and slavery abolitionist.
